



## UKCA marking of floors in the course of Brexit

Dresden, 11/09/2024

Dear customers,

The United Kingdom (UK) left the European Union (EU) on 01/01/2021.

Prior to this, a trade agreement was signed between the United Kingdom and the European Union on 24/12/2020.

With the withdrawal, the following requirements for the marking of construction products for export in the UK incl. Northern Ireland (NI) come into force:

For construction products, the UKCA marking is now legally binding. This marking is necessary to sell your products on the UK market. The previously set transitional period until 30/06/2025 was revoked on 02/09/2024 (<https://www.gov.uk/guidance/construction-products-regulation-in-great-britain>). Thus it is possible to continue to CE mark existing products based on the harmonized standards EN 14041/EN 14342/EN 14904 (<https://www.gov.uk/guidance/using-the-ukca-marking>).

The basis for the UKCA marking are so-called "Designated Standards", which have the same legal basis as the harmonized standards. Currently, the "Designated Standards" and the harmonized standards are identical, but this may change in the future.

Currently CE marked products will continue to be accepted in Northern Ireland (see annex).

The conformity assessment for the UKCA mark is carried out by "UK Approved Bodies", which issue corresponding certificates.

EPH as an European Notified Body cooperates in the flooring sector with the UK Approved Body SATRA. This body is willing to provide UKCA certification on a cost basis after reviewing our documents (test reports/CE test certificates, available in English). For this purpose, the documents issued by EPH must be submitted to SATRA. The flooring collections are to be described in SATRA forms. In order to accept the EPH documents the performance of at least one indicative fire test by UK Approved Bodies is mandatory from December 2022. The contact person at SATRA is Mr. Phil Weal. The same procedure can be carried out with EPH surveillance reports in the frame of system 1 of the above named harmonized standards.

## Annex Overview about possibilities of placing goods

Action	Type of good (see list of product areas below)	Accepted marking or combination of markings*
Placing goods on the market in Northern Ireland	Manufactured goods being placed on the market in NI using an EU conformity assessment body	CE
	Manufactured goods being placed on the market in NI using a UK-based body	CE and UKNI
Placing goods on the market in Great Britain	Manufactured goods being placed on the GB market until 30/06/2025	UKCA or CE
	Manufactured goods placed on the GB market from 01/07/2025	UKCA
Placing qualifying Northern Ireland goods on the market in Great Britain (unfettered access)	Qualifying Northern Ireland goods being placed on the GB market under unfettered access	CE or CE and UKNI
Placing goods on the EU market	Manufactured goods being placed on the EU market	CE

\*You may use combinations of the product markings listed in each box and your goods may be acceptable with more than one marking. For example, a product with both the CE and UKCA markings can be placed on the EU market. However, for the EU market the CE mark must appear without the UKNI indication as goods bearing the 'CE and UKNI' marking are not acceptable in the EU market. This means these goods must be manufactured according to EU rules and cannot be assessed by a body based in the UK.
